**Walking into the city with places of interest –
German pupils and teachers guide the group.**

On Thursday, November 13th, we started our tour at the “Nürnberg Stadtpark”.



Next stop was the “Straße der Kinderrechte”-Street of human rights of children.

The „Straße der Kinderrechte“, was built in the park near our school.

It was finished in October 2014.



In the middle of the Stadtpark we stopped at the “Neptunbrunnen”.

Originally the Neptunbrunnen was planned to replace the „Schöne Brunnen“. It was erected at the Hauptmarkt.

But the National Socialist Party didn't want it there, so it was moved to Nuremberg Stadtpark.



We walked along the City wall to the “Sieben Zeilen”, a historic industrial housing area.



Our next stop was Egidienkirche and the famous „Schöne Brunnen“.

The rows of 40 stone figures represent the world-view of the Holy Roman Empire. The railing with the famous brass ring, that grants a wish when turned, was made in 1587.



After the city walk the group conquered the “Nürnberger Burg” the middle-age castle which is one of the town’s landmarks.



Here we were guided by professional guides of the castle.

They showed us the most important and interesting places.

Including the “Kassematten”, the “Burgfreiung”, the deep fountain and the place at the city wall were the robbery knight Epplein jumped off the castle, as legend has it.



Finally we climbed up the „Sinnwell Tower“ with its over one hundred steps and enjoyed the best view over the city.



After the city tour we split up into two groups for the evening program: bowling and swimming.
